Larry Rifkin, who brought *Barney & Friends* and UCONN's Women's basketball to TV, will be here on **Tuesday, February 8th at 12:30pm**, following Café Lunch, to talk about his new book, "*No Dead Air*". Mr. Rifkin hosted "*Talk of the Town*" on WATR 1320 for seven years & grew up in Waterbury.

Mr. Rifkin was the programming executive for Connecticut Public Television (CPTV) for over a quarter of a century, from 1986 to 2009. Many programming accomplishments were attributed to his leadership. '*Barney & Friends*' went on to become one of the most successful children's television series in history and he helped propel women's sports on TV nationally.

Under his leadership, CPTV amassed over fifty Emmy Awards in the Boston/New England competition. And he was inducted into the Boston/New England Silver Circle in 2006, the regional television equivalent of a Lifetime Achievement Award.

He now hosts the podcast, *americatrendspodcast.com*, where he looks at changes in our society and our politics. He is approaching 500 episodes recorded.

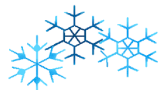

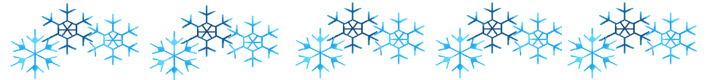

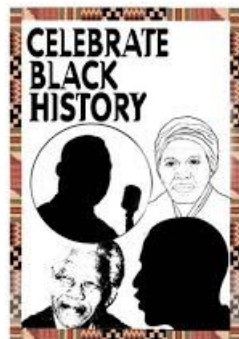

HOME OWNERS TAX CREDIT

PROPERTY TAX CREDIT FOR ELDERLY/DISABLED

THERE ARE CERTAIN EXEMPTIONS THAT MAY BE DEDUCTED FROM YOUR ASSESSMENT FOR A REDUCTION IN TAXES. THESE EXEMPTIONS ARE APPLIED TO THE REAL ESTATE ASSESSMENTS FIRST. IF THE TAXPAYER DOES NOT OWN REAL ESTATE, THEN THE EXEMPTION IS APPLIED TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE ASSESSMENT.

The filing period to complete an application is FEB 1 THRU MAY 15 2022. Income guidelines are \$38,100 for a single household and \$46,400 for a married household.

ELDERLY MUST BE 65 YEARS OF AGE (OR OLDER) BY DECEMBER 31ST PRIOR TO APPLICATION. TO APPLY FOR THIS PROGRAM, YOU MUST COME TO THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE WITH YOUR FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN IF YOU STILL FILE, AND/OR ALL PRIOR YEAR TOTAL INCOME DOCUMENTS. THIS EXEMPTION HAS TO BE REAPPLIED FOR EVERY TWO YEARS.

VETERANS – CAN RECEIVE AN EXEMPTION IF THEIR DD214 (MILITARY DISCHARGE FORM) IS RECORDED AT THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE AND THEY SERVED A MINIMUM OF 90 DAYS ACTIVE DUTY DURING WARTIME. THE DD214 MUST BE RECORDED PRIOR TO OCTOBER 1 OF ANY YEAR TO BEGIN RECEIVING THE EXEMPTION ON THE NEXT YEAR'S TAX BILL. THE DD214 NEED ONLY BE RECORDED ONCE IN A LIFETIME. **DISABLED VETERANS** – QUALIFY FOR A HIGHER \$ EXEMPTION THAN NON DISABLED VETS. TO QUALIFY, YOU MUST BRING IN THE BENEFITS PAYMENT STATEMENT ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS IN SEPTEMBER AND SUBMIT IT TO THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE BEFORE OCTOBER 1ST. THIS DOES NOT NEED TO BE REAPPLIED FOR, UNLESS THE FEDERAL VETERANS ADMINISTRATION MODIFIES THE VETERAN'S % DISABILITY RATING. TO APPLY, THE VETERAN MUST COME TO THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE AND BRING ALL PROOFS OF INCOME FOR THE PREVIOUS YEAR. INCOME INCLUDES FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN (IF YOU STILL FILE), SOCIAL SECURITY 1099 FORM AND/OR ALL YEAR END INCOME TAX DOCUMENTS. IF YOU QUALIFY, THIS DOUBLES THE VETERAN'S EXEMPTION THAT YOU ALREADY RECEIVE. THIS EXEMPTION HAS TO BE REAPPLIED FOR EVERY TWO YEARS.

DISABILITY EXEMPTION – WILL BE EFFECTIVE ON OCTOBER 1 FOLLOWING THE APPLICANT'S FILING DATE. TO QUALIFY, A PERSON MUST BE 100% DISABLED AND BRING SOCIAL SECURITY AWARD LETTER OR LETTER FROM VETERAN'S ADMINISTRATION. YOU DO NOT HAVE TO APPLY EVERY YEAR.

BLIND EXEMPTION – YOU CAN APPLY ANYTIME TO QUALIFY, A PERSON MUST BRING TO THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE THE CERTIFICATE OF LEGAL BLINDNESS ISSUED BY THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT. YOU CAN APPLY ANYTIME. YOU DO NOT HAVE TO REAPPLY EVERY YEAR.

Social Security Scam Alert

The Social Security Administration will never threaten, scare or pressure you to take immediate action.

If you receive a call, text or email that:

- Threatens to suspend your SS number
- Warns of arrest or legal action
- Demands immediate payment
- Requires payment by gift card, prepaid debit card, internet currency or mailing cash
- Pressures you for personal information
- Requests secrecy
- Threatens to seize your bank account
- Promises to increase your SS benefit
- Tries to gain your trust by providing fake “documentation”, “evidence”, or the name of a real government official ...

IT IS A SCAM!

- Stay Calm - DO NOT provide personal information
- Hang Up!

Learn How To Make an Online Medicare Account

Medicare has a free, secure, online service for managing your personal information regarding Medicare Part A and Part B benefits.

You can use this account to check information about your coverage, enrollment status, and Medicare claims. Your Medicare account has a number of tools you can use to manage your personal healthcare and coverage needs.

Some of the topics that will be covered are:

- Keeping track of your Medicare claims,
- Review when you got your most recent flu shot,
- Cardiovascular disease screening, or other preventive services,
- Check your Part D deductible for the year,
- Manage your prescription drug list and much more.

You must bring your red, white and blue Medicare card with you to this class.
